### **Welcome**

It is a pleasure to welcome all of the students and their parents to Shasta High School. We have had an excellent start to the school year and we are looking forward to another great year. Our staff has been very impressed with the behavior and attitude of the freshmen class. Once again our school has been recognized by "Newsweek" as one of the top high schools in the nation. We are anxiously awaiting the state to post our new Academic Performance Index score. We have it estimated at 805 which is the culmination of a ten year goal for us at SHS. The state has set the bar at 800 and we believe that we have reached that magic number. Of course, we will not stop pushing our staff and students to continue to improve our Academic Performance Index. A high score on this important indicator helps our/your students' to get into competitive colleges and universities. This score is one more factor used along with your student's SAT/ACT scores, GPA, and course selections that are used by college admissions officers. You will hear more about this test and its importance this spring when we are preparing our/your students' for the 2009-2010 administration. Please help us work with your kids on the character trait of responsibility. We are focusing on garbage so that our campus is clean and presentable. Many students seem to forget, or in some cases just don't care and leave their garbage on the ground instead of placing it in a trash can.

Along the lines of keeping our campus clean, I need to address the H1N1 flu. It is a reality in our country and county. If a student has the flu, any flu, you need to keep them at home. They can return to campus 24 hours after their fever has broken. This guideline is set by Shasta County Public Health and the Center for Disease Control. Welcome back! It seems like just yesterday when we were sitting on a soggy Thompson Field graduating the class of 2009. Now it is 105 degrees and I am writing the September Admin Zone column. Where did the summer go? If the first few weeks are any indication of how the school year is going to be, then we are headed for a good year. The students and staff have been upbeat and ready to work. To help maintain a good environment, there are a few items that have come up. The first is dress code. Please remember that head covering is not allowed. This includes hats, bandanas, and scarves. Also, tops shall have a one inch wide straps that cover bra straps and cover the entire mid section and sides. Tube tops and strapless dresses are not allowed. Remember also that cell phones and other electronic devices are not to be used during class time.

**Attendance:** Remember the 48 hour rule. If your child is absent from school, you have 48 hours to clear it with a call to the attendance office (225-8444) or send a note to school with your child the day he/she returns. If it is not cleared, it will be coded as truancy and Saturday School will be assigned.

**Parking/Congestion:** Please obey the traffic laws around campus, particularly the no parking areas. Cars that are illegally parked or parked without the proper parking permit will be given a \$10 ticket. Parents please use caution and exercise patience when picking up or dropping off your child, as it can get a bit hectic during morning drop off and afternoon pick up.

**Short Term Independent Study (STIS):**

It is strongly encouraged that students be in school; however, if there are extenuating circumstances that requires a student to miss five or more days of school then they should sign up for STIS. Students need to give a minimum of five school days notice prior to going on STIS.

Short Term Independent Study

It is strongly recommended that students be in school every day, however if there are extenuating circumstances that require a student to miss five or more days of school then he/she should sign up for STIS. Students need to give a minimum of **5 school days notice prior to going on STIS**. Please notify school personnel as early as possible with the dates of the absence by sending in a note with your child or by speaking with Ms. Allpress in the main office to begin the paperwork.

EC 48980 (k) The notification shall advise the parent or guardian that no pupil may have his or her grade reduced or lose academic credit for any absence or absences excused pursuant to Section 48205 if missed assignments and tests that can reasonably be provided are satisfactorily completed within a reasonable period of time, and shall include the full text of Section 48205.

EC 48205 (b) A pupil absent from school under this section shall be allowed to complete all assignments and tests missed during the absence that can be reasonably provided and, upon satisfactory completion within a reasonable period of time, shall be given full credit therefore. The teacher of any class from which a pupil is absent shall determine the tests and assignments shall be reasonably equivalent to, but not necessarily identical to, the tests and assignments that the pupil missed during the absence.
