9th Grade Counseling Calendar

Be sure to make an annual "counselor check in" appointment and get on the A to G track

August - September

- 1. Establish a schedule with A to G college preparatory classes. Your schedule should consist of at least 4 college preparatory classes including:
 - English (CP or Honors)
 - Math (CP or Honors)
 - Social Science (CP or Honors)
 - Science CP Earth or CP/Medical Biology (Honors track)
 - Physical Education
 - Elective (Foreign Language, Visual/Performing Art, Practical Art)
 - ➤ To be A G qualified for college admission, you must complete 15 year long high school courses with a grade of C or better at least 11 of them prior to your senior year. Discuss with your Counselor.
- 2. Activate and maintain a **NAVIANCE** account, your ID# is your log on and your network password is your Naviance password.
- 3. Activate an Aeries account using your verification code that you received at registration or contact the counseling office. If you don't have an email account, activate a student email account by going to gmail in google and put in your student ID# at SUHSD.net and use your network password.

October – December

- 4. If you begin to struggle academically, see your counselor and attend after school tutoring in the library.
- 5. Check your Aeries for progress.
- 6. Meet with your counselor to create a tentative four-year plan and discuss A-G eligibility plan.
- 7. Complete Career Interest inventory in your Social Science class.
- 8. Earn good grades! Ninth grade DOES count. You will have far more options if you start planning now for college.
- 9. Prepare for finals semester grades appear on your transcript.

January - February

- 10. Use Naviance to take a personality/career interest inventory.
- 11. Attend a pre-registration presentation with your counselor.
- 12. Create a file for the following documents:
 - Awards and honors
 - School and community activities in which you are involved with descriptions
 - Start building your resume

March - June

- 13. Select courses for 10th grade with your parents.
- 14. Continue to earn good grades! Consider summer school courses to remediate any D's or F's (don't get behind).
