SHASTA UNION HSD CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION

The Shasta Union High School District serves 2340 students on our 3 comprehensive school sites, our continuation school and our District Farm in Career Technical Education programs. The CTE program is designed to provide all students with opportunities for enhanced learning experiences, preparation for future career and college decisions and realistic view of the world of work. Various pathways include Industry Competencies that can lead to industry certifications, Shasta College Articulation Credit and/or Shasta College Dual Enrollment Credit and post-secondary opportunities.

As many slaves were not allowed to have tombstones, pottery and face jugs were used as grave markers. Masks play an important role in ceremonies, rituals, and masquerades across West, Central and Southern Africa.

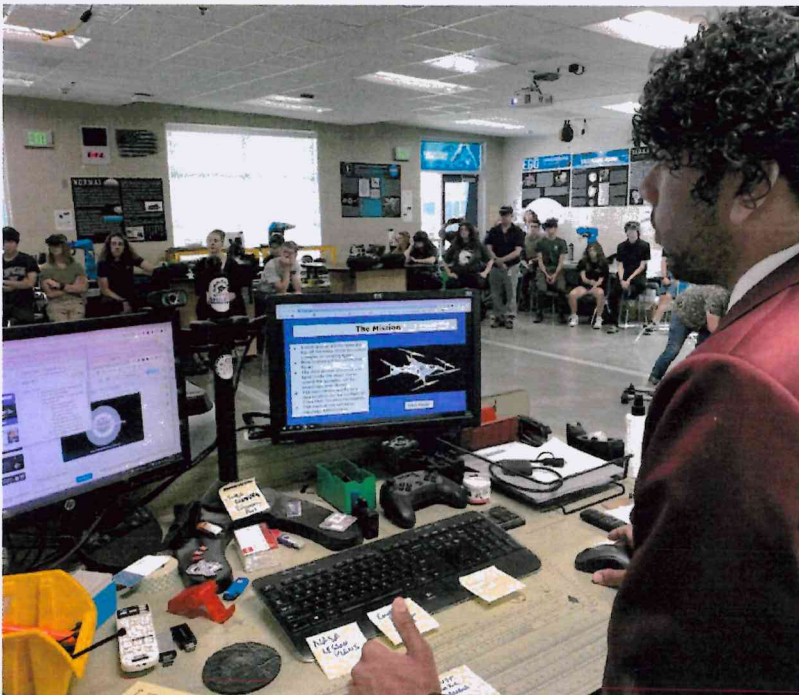

SHS SPACE SCIENCE

In our NASA project, students in Space Science and CAD have been developing deep space missions to distant worlds where only nuclear power can work to power a spacecraft. Students research the mission based on authentic NASA data, and CAD students then model the spacecraft in 3D space. Using Augmented Reality glasses, students project their spacecraft into the room, where NASA Scientists and Engineers can 'port' into the same space to view what the students have built.

Students learned the proper use of PPE (Personal Protective Equipment), held a race and learned how to get out of contaminated PPE.

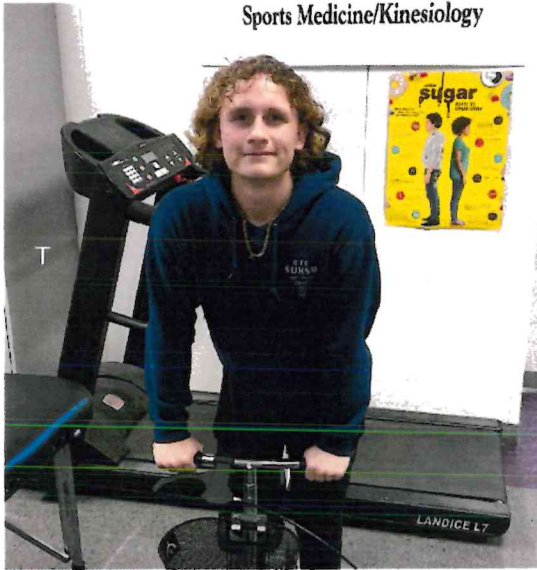

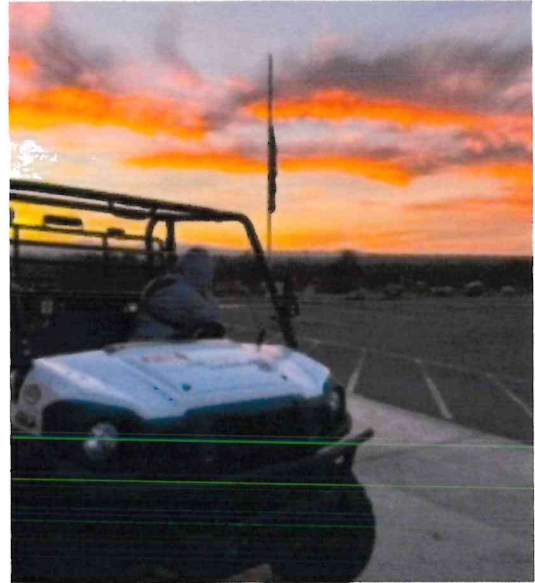
